Various valuable lectures were delivered by the teachers on this occasion. Awareness about various stress buster techniques was also given to the audience.

World Arthritis Day

The motive for organizing the World Arthritis Day (WAD) was to make people aware with a rheumatic, musculoskeletal and other degenerative diseases directly or indirectly related to musculoskeletal diseases. Therefore, to make the public aware about the Arthritis the National Institute of Unani Medicine with the assistance of department of Tahaffuzi wa Samaji Tib organized World Arthritis Day on 12th of October every year. In this Programme, faculty members made the public aware about the prevention from musculoskeletal diseases, especially Arthritis.

National Nutrition Week

The objective to celebrate National Nutrition Week -2018 is 'healthy eating habits and to create awareness about nutrition'. National Nutrition week is observed between 1st -7th September every year. The theme for National Nutrition Week 2018 is 'Go Further with Food'. As per the latest data available "roughly 40% of children under five are stunted and 21% of children under five are severely wasted or undernourished". Nearly half of all deaths in children under age 05 are attributable to under-nutrition. This translates into an unnecessary loss of about 03 million young lives a year. In India itself, 3,000 children die every day due to malnutrition. Therefore, as per the directions from Govt. of India door to door campaign were conducted in a pre-identified colony, school surveys are also arranged in which doctors explain about the health, nutrition, healthy diet to school children. During the whole week awareness programmes were conducted in which valuable lectures were delivered by the faculty members in intelligible languages to the public.

World Leprosy Day

World Leprosy Day is observed internationally every year on the last Sunday of January to increase the public awareness of the Leprosy or Hansen's Disease. This date was chosen by

French humanitarian Raoul Follereau as a tribute to the life of the Mahatma Gandhi who had compassion for people afflicted with leprosy. National Institute of Unani Medicine also organized a free counselling camp inside the campus to educated people about the Leprosy. Doctors of the department of Tahaffuzi wa Samaji along with PG scholars were deputed at the camp. The main areas covered by the doctors and educated the public are: Leprosy is curable with MDT (multi drug therapy). Multi drug therapy taken regularly ensures complete cure of leprosy, prevents deformities and stops transmission to other individuals. Early diagnosis, appropriate treatment and completion of full course will prevent disability due to leprosy. Leprosy is not hereditary; it does not transmit form parents to children. Leprosy does not spread through causal touch like shaking hands or playing together, or working in same office. Close and frequent contacts with untreated cases favour the spread. Leprosy is not the result of past sins or immoral behaviour. It is caused by a bacterium called Mycobacterium leprae. People affected by leprosy have right to livelihood and right to live with dignity.

Observation of World Breast Feeding Week

World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) is an annual celebration which is being held every year from 1-7th August in more than 120 countries. It refers to coordinated activities and policies to promote health among women, newborns and infants through breastfeeding.

The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends infants should be exclusively breastfed for the first six months of life to achieve optimal health and development, followed by complementary foods while continuing breastfeeding for up to two years or beyond.

NIUM celebrates World Breast feeding Week with the initiatives of Department of Ilmul Qabalat wa Amraze Niswan from 1-7th August every year. During the whole week the lectures were conducted for the lactating mothers in the NIUM hospital in which breast feeding benefits for babies were informed. They were informed that the breast milk is nature's perfect baby food. It contains immunity-boosting antibodies and healthy enzymes. It protects against allergies and eczema, and may causes less stomach upset, diarrhoea, and constipation. It also reduces the risk of virus attacks, urinary tract infections, inflammatory bowel disease, gastroenteritis, ear infections, and respiratory infections. It also protects against diseases such as spinal meningitis, Type-1 diabetes, and Hodgkin's lymphoma. Besides demonstrating the health benefits for breastfed children, the health benefits for women were also taken-up. It lowers the risk of breast



and ovarian cancer. It helps the women to lose pregnancy weight, it triggers uterus to shrink back to pre-pregnancy size. It may also lower the risk of osteoporosis. It heals the body after delivery and delays menstruation.

Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

Ovarian cancer is a silent killer, so the best way to protect is to find the cancer early. Ovarian cancer is the third most common cancer in women and more women die of this cancer than from any other reproductive cancer. The risk factors for ovarian cancer are older women, nulliparity, endometriosis, if the women had breast, uterine or colorectal cancer or if close family member have had ovarian cancer. Women had a lower chance of getting ovarian cancer, if she had tubal ligation, hysterectomy or oophorectomy and many children's. It is asymptomatic in the beginning and symptoms occur in severe stage only. The only symptom the patient's presents is abdominal discomfort and gastritis, which is not responding to antacid in the initial stage of the disease. In later stage the patient present with the symptoms like pain, feeling of fullness, bloating, lump in the belly; gastric problems like nausea, vomiting, lack of appetite and feeling fullness after eating light and small meals. Abdominal discomfort, back pain and dyspareunia, abnormal bleeding/discharge from vagina, sudden weight loss or gain with apparent reason, fatigue etc. In suspected cases after the physical examination, patients were evaluated with USG or MRI or CT scan and CA 125 and in such cases NIUM provided free Ultra sound. Due to this the dept. of Ilmul Qabalat wa Amraze Niswan organized the month of September every year as an Ovarian Awareness Month. Various lectures were delivered by the doctors along with power point presentation in OPDs. Pamphlets were distributed to the patients arrived at NIUM OPD. Door to door campaigns were also conducted during the whole month. More than 6500 patients arrived at NIUM OPD were counselled with the Ovarian Cancer and its prevention and early detection and treatment. Use of herbal immunomodulators for prevention of Ovarian Cancer was suggested to the mases such as Use of food, rich in antioxidants like green vegetables, fresh fruits, fibers, whole grains, proteins etc, can help to prevent it. Unani medicines which are effective in prevention of ovarian cancer are, Asgand, Kutki, Neem, Tulsi, Karela, Jamun, Amaltas, Chal Arjun, Musli safed, Jadwar, Satavar, Amla, Elva, Haldi, Zafran, Lehsun, Adrak and so



Observation of Breast Cancer Awareness month

National Breast Cancer Awareness Month (NBCAM) is an annual international health campaign organized every October to increase awareness of the disease and its cause prevention, diagnosis, treatment and cure. The aim of the NBCAM is to promote awareness of breast cancer. The Department of Ilmul Qabalat wa Amraze Niswan in collaboration with NIUM Hospital, organized and observed Breast Cancer awareness month from 1-31st October, every year.

Banners and charts showing importance of Breast Cancer awareness were depicted covering different areas of the Institute's Hospital to bring awareness in general public in local language Kannada, English and Urdu. The faculty members of the department of Ilmul Qabalat wa Amraze Niswan gave valuable lectures during the whole month in an easy and local languages. Help of audio visual gadgets were also taken to make the programme more effective and emphasis was laid upon the prophylactic aspects of the diseases. The primary purpose for the campaign is to promote screening mammography as the most effective was to save the lives by detecting Breast Cancer at early stages. Suspected cases were referred for free scanning. Patients who attended the hospital are educated about the awareness of Breast Cancer, its early detection and treatment.

Observation of Cervical Cancer Awareness month

Cervical cancer is the 2nd most common cancer and 5th most deadly cancer in women. It affects 16 lakh women per year and kills 9 lakh per year. Eighty percent of cervical cancer occurs in developing countries. HPV infection is the greatest risk factor for cervical cancer. Other risk factors include HIV, chlamydial infection, skin related disorders, dietary factors, hormonal contraception, multiple pregnancies, exposure to DES, familial, early marriage, early use of OC pills. The most common symptoms of cervical cancer are abnormal vaginal bleeding, foul smelling discharge, post coital bleeding and general weakness in postmenopausal women.

Pap smear is important screening test for the detection of cervical cancer. You can treat early cervical cell changes (dysplasia), which can reduce your risk for cervical cancer. If Pap test is positive, colposcopy directed biopsy is helpful in staging the disease. According to ACOG, Pap smear should be done in all sexually active women above the age of 18 years and repeated every 3 years if negative. HPV vaccine can be given to prevent cervical cancer in a three dose schedule.

Department of Ilmul Qabalat wa Amraze Niswan observed every January as cervical cancer awareness and screening month. Audio visual awareness and campaign related to cervical cancer was conducted for OPD and IPD patients daily in different languages. Many patients attended the program every year. Door to door campaign are carried out in which patients are screened clinically many patients got their pap smear done. Peoples who attended NIUM hospital were counseled about the Cervical cancer Awareness, and they were provided with detail informative pamphlets in Kannada, English and Urdu regarding cervical cancer and importance of Pap smear.

Use of Unani herbal antioxidants, immunomodulator, daily bath and cleanliness can prevent and reduce the risk of cervical cancer. Women who smoke cigarettes or who breathe in secondhand smoke have a higher risk for cervical cell changes that can lead to cervical cancer was highlighted in pamphlets and awareness program. Quitting smoking may decrease this risk.

Hindi Pakhwada Celebration at NIUM

Every Year on 14th September, Hindi Divas is celebrated all over the Country to remember the historic events related to Hindi and to promote and propagate the Hindi Language. Hindi written in Devanagiri script has been approved as an official language by the Constituent Assembly and thereafter 14th September is celebrated as Hindi Divas and as per the directions from Govt. of India, Hindi *Pakhwada* is celebrated in the institute from 14th - 28th September every year; the main motive is to promote and give priority to the Hindi language, and to implement Hindi in each and every Govt. offices. The celebrations under this programme were essay writings, storytelling, poem recitations etc. Many staff members and P.G. Scholars participated in the programme. The Programme was concluded with the prize distribution by the Director of the institute.
